Call to worship and welcome

Prayers of adoration and confession

Our prayer of adoration this week is the lectionary Psalm for today, from Psalm 104,

¹ Praise the Lord, my soul.

Lord my God, you are very great; you are clothed with splendour and majesty.

²The Lord wraps himself in light as with a garment; he stretches out the heavens like a tent

3 and lays the beams of his upper chambers on their waters.

He makes the clouds his chariot

and rides on the wings of the wind.

⁴ He makes winds his messengers, flames of fire his servants.

- ⁵ He set the earth on its foundations; it can never be moved.
- ⁶ You covered it with the watery depths as with a garment; the waters stood above the mountains.
- ⁷ But at your rebuke the waters fled, at the sound of your thunder they took to flight;
- 8 they flowed over the mountains, they went down into the valleys, to the place you assigned for them.
- ⁹ You set a boundary they cannot cross; never again will they cover the earth.
- ²⁴ How many are your works, Lord! In wisdom you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.
- ³⁵ But may sinners vanish from the earth and the wicked be no more.

Bible readings: Job 38:1-7, 34-41 and Mark 10:35-45 – Jill

Job 38:1-7, 34-41

Then the Lord spoke to Job out of the storm. He said:

- ² "Who is this that obscures my plans with words without knowledge?
- ³ Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me.
- ⁴ "Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand.
- ⁵ Who marked off its dimensions? Surely you know! Who stretched a measuring line across it?
- ⁶ On what were its footings set, or who laid its cornerstone—
- ⁷ while the morning stars sang together and all the angels shouted for joy?

. . .

- ³⁴ "Can you raise your voice to the clouds and cover yourself with a flood of water?
- ³⁵ Do you send the lightning bolts on their way? Do they report to you, 'Here we are'?
- ³⁶ Who gives the ibis wisdom or gives the rooster understanding?
- ³⁷ Who has the wisdom to count the clouds? Who can tip over the water jars of the heavens
- ³⁸ when the dust becomes hard and the clods of earth stick together?
- ³⁹ "Do you hunt the prey for the lioness and satisfy the hunger of the lions
- ⁴⁰ when they crouch in their dens or lie in wait in a thicket?
- Who provides food for the raven when its young cry out to God and wander about for lack of food?

Mark 10:35-45

- ³⁵ Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."
- ³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.
- ³⁷ They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."
- ³⁸ "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"

³⁹ "We can," they answered.

Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with, ⁴⁰ but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared."

⁴¹ When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. ⁴² Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ⁴³ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. ⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

We come with our prayers for ourselves and others, trusting in the one who is mystery beyond mystery, revealed through Jesus, experienced as a Spirit communing with our spirit.

We pray for an awakening in ourselves to the impact that our consumption has on other peoples.

In hope, we utter our words to you, our God, trusting in the promises of Jesus. We pray for people around the world still impacted by the pandemic of COVID-19; for those who grieve loved ones; for those struggling with long covid; with those who are unable to receive treatment for other conditions; for those who have fallen into poverty. May they experience your healing and wholeness through the love of kin and neighbour?

With sadness, we utter our words to you, our God, trusting in the promises of Jesus. For the tens of millions of people, seeking refuge from war, violence, or extreme poverty, we pray for their welfare and for the mainly poor nations who are struggling to host and care for them. We pray that the leaders of rich nations would find ways of relieving the burden and welcoming needy strangers into our lands.

In loving concern for our neighbours and kin, we utter our words to you, our God, trusting in the promises of Jesus. We pray for those dear to us going through difficult times. Help us, O God, to find ways of bringing your healing and wholeness to them.

To all these prayers and the prayers of our hearts, we say "may it be so – Amen"
