We pray that these games will promote harmony and good fellowship around the world.

Father, we note that recently 14,000 scientists from 34 countries have reported to the magazine Bioscience about the effects of global warming on our planet earth. With such little time left to make any major improvement, may our leaders in all countries realise the urgency of the problem, and have the courage to make hard decisions even if unpopular. Father we know you love your wonderful creation of our planet earth and we ask for the wisdom to care for it and preserve it for our children and future generations.

Finally Father, we pray for this your Church here at St Ives. We are all yearning to come together in person but are unable for the moment. Bind us together Father as we care for each other as best we can remotely. We thank you for modern technology which can allow us to see, hear and share with each other, even if not in person.

We pray for all those in our family who are battling illness, low spirits, loneliness and uncertainty. We ask that they will know your blessing and feel the comfort and strength of your Holy Spirit as He surrounds them. Please support them, encourage them and give them peace.

Show us Father the real and practical ways in which we can help wherever possible.

We give thanks for the ministry of Richie as he now leads us week by week. We thank you for his faith and inspiration and ask for your blessing upon both him and Beth as we worship together in the next months.

And we ask all these things in and through the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ who taught us to pray
