Bible readings

John 6:56-69 (New International Version)

⁵⁶ Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. ⁵⁷ Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. ⁵⁸ This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." ⁵⁹ He said this while teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum.

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- ⁶⁰ On hearing it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?"
- ⁶¹ Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, "Does this offend you? ⁶² Then what if you see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before! ⁶³ The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you—they are full of the Spirit and life. ⁶⁴ Yet there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him. ⁶⁵ He went on to say, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless the Father has enabled them."
- ⁶⁶ From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him.
- ⁶⁷ "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Jesus asked the Twelve.
- ⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

Ephesians 6:10-20 (New International Version)

¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. ¹¹ Put on the full armour of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. ¹² For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. ¹³ Therefore put on the full armour of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, ¹⁵ and

with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

¹⁸ And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. ¹⁹ Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should.

Prayer for others

Gracious God,

What a week it has been for us. For your people. For your world. It is hard, sometimes, to look forward and see hope, to see a way that things may be made right.

We see the incredible efforts of those battling the pandemic, those making, transporting and delivering vaccines, those contact tracing, and those treating people affected. We see the work of our diplomats and the defense forces trying to help the people of Afghanistan – a country which seems to be in a hopeless situation. We see people fighting wildfires in places we never expected to see wildfires. People do so much, they work so hard, but the problems we face can't be fixed by our own efforts. What do we do, God?

We despair at these things Lord. And we feel guilty about the problems that we face. How does our frustration with lockdown rules compare with those who are oppressed in their own countries. We miss face-to-face contact with our friends and family, but we feel guilty because we know there are so many others whose loved ones have died. What do we do, God?

We rejoice that so few in Australia have died from Covid, but we are grimly aware that people have died from Covid – can we really rejoice while people mourn the loss of their loved ones. What do we do, God?

We see the situation in Afghanistan, a situation that our own nation has contributed too, but a situation that has also come and gone over history. Our country tries to help, but some claim it is too little, too late, and others say that we shouldn't have gone there in the first place. What do we do, God?

We feel guilty for the things we have, for our own health and safety, for our wealth, for our stable way of life, for the technology that enables us to stay connected even when we can't meet face-to-face. But we are aware of so many across the world, and even in our own country who do not have those things. What do we do, God.

It all seems so difficult, God, but we turn do you.

We thank you for the blessings of our lives, and we ask you to keep us mindful of them, not so we are weighed down by guilt, but so we can use them as best we can to help our neighbours, whether next door or across the world.

We thank you for raising up leaders who have been able to keep the pandemic under control in Australia. We uphold them to you, and pray that they will use the wisdom you have given them to govern this country with mercy and compassion, but they will also be mindful of helping people in other places.

We know that we are better off than most other people in the world, but we also acknowledge the isolation and frustration that we feel in this time of lockdown. Help us to exercise the gift of patience that you have given us at this time. Help us to use this time productively. Help us to draw closer to you.

We know that you gave your Son to become one of us – to live a human life, to die a human death. Help us to remember that you know all the pain and frustration of human life. You are not a distant God, help us not to be distant from you.

Help us to remember that we are not alone. Help us to remember that even though we do good things, we cannot solve all the problems of this world through our own efforts.

We trust in your unfailing mercy, shown to us in your Son who lived and died for us, and taught us to pray:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.

Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever.
